# Finding the golden eggs

Follow the clues on the following page to find where the Easter Bunny has hidden his five golden eggs. When you correctly find the location by zooming in to that area, a golden egg will appear. Click on the golden egg to see the address and copy it down on the next page.

**Note:** be sure to zoom right into the area you think each egg has been hidden. The eggs will only show up on the map when you have zoomed in close to the hidden location.

The 1<sup>st</sup> Golden Egg

I have hidden this golden egg on a remote island approximately 730km from one of Australia's major cities. This island is the largest of a chain of islands known as an archipelago. No humans live on this island, but tourists regularly fly over it to take photos of a uniquely coloured lake on the island, where the lake's water is pink. You can find this golden egg floating on the lake's water, due to its extreme salinity.

## The 2<sup>nd</sup> Golden Egg

This egg has been hidden at a very popular tourist and holiday destination along the eastern coast of Australia. The town is famous for its laid-back lifestyle, where you can swim among shipwrecks in crystal-blue water, attend major music festivals, sight turtles, dolphins and humpback whales, and enjoy spectacular views. You can find this golden egg near a lighthouse that was built to protect ships passing cliffs and submerged rocks on the eastern coastline.

## The 3<sup>rd</sup> Golden Egg

I have hidden this egg among limestone stacks that rise just off the beachline of the Southern Ocean. The beaches aren't accessible by foot due to steep and staggering cliff faces. These striking cliffs and stacks have been eroded by the wind and waves after millions of years. Some of the stacks have since collapsed, after the wind and waves cut too much of the rock away. You can find this egg between two of the standing stacks so look carefully!

### The 4<sup>th</sup> Golden Egg

This golden egg has been hidden in a small city that was built around huge mining operations in remote Australia. The city is affectionately known as the *oasis of the outback* and has a population of around 18,500 people. A lake lies to the north of the city, but you will find this egg on the south side of the city, where people go to play a sport that uses clubs and requires you to walk long distances between shots.

The 5<sup>th</sup> Golden Egg

Address: \_\_\_\_\_

I have hidden this egg in Australia's red centre at a location that is considered sacred to the local Aboriginal Anangu people, who have inhabited the area for more than 22,000 years. This place is in a National Park and is recognised by UNESCO as a World Heritage Area for its natural and cultural values. The place that I have hidden this egg is easy to see from above because it is a monolith...and no, it is not Uluru.
